MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President Donald Stoner, Jr. at 7 p.m.

Preston Spahr, Mercersburg Vibrancy Steering Committee, gave an update on the development of a Comprehensive Plan saying an application requesting \$45,000 in matching funds was submitted to DCED and an RFP was sent out to 12 contractors. He reiterated that Council is to submit their top three priorities by the end of the year.

Rockwell Construction emailed an update on the Seminary Street Project which read: roof to be done by October 31 on west building; trusses setting on east building; continued floor structure first floor to roof; and windows to be installed starting on third floor working down. Beginning week of October 9, one lane of Seminary Street will open until roof trusses arrive in later October.

On a Sipes/Burkot motion, Council unanimously approved COA 2023-10.01.

Motion to approve HARB Application 2023-10.02 229 South Main Street, Mercersburg, PA.

On a Morgan/Sipes motion, Council unanimously approved COA 2023-10.02.

Street Sweeping will be done Tuesday, October 31, 2023.

A Special Event Permit was approved for the Council for Wellness 12th Annual 5 Mile Run/Walk to be held October 21, 2023, from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m.

2024 MMOs distribution to Dunbar, Bender, Zapf pensions. Requesting motion to approve (Police Retirement Plan) (Non-Uniform Employee's Pension Plan). Stoner said the minimum municipal obligation for the Uniform Police Retirement Plan is \$0 and the Non-Uniform Employee's Pension Plan municipal obligation is \$40,584 with an estimated state aid of \$23,311 leaving a balance of \$17,273 to be split between borough, water, and sewer. The borough's obligation would be \$5,392.52.

On a Minton/Morgan motion, Council voted unanimously to put a contribution towards that.

Resolution 10-23 authorizing the borough to continue with the LSA grant which the borough is applying for on behalf of the fire department and Mercersburg Lions Club in the amount of \$600,000. On a recommendation by Coccorese, Council voted to amend the resolution to increase the requested amount of grant money to \$700,000 split evenly between the fire department and Lions Club projects.

On a Heefner/Minton Council unanimously voted to amend Resolution 10-23 to break it down that

the funding for the project for the fire department would be \$350,000 and the funding for the Mercersburg Lions Club would be \$350,000.

Public Works is requesting the purchase of a 3.6HP Honda Vibratory Rammer Jumping Jack Tamper at 3550PSF for \$3187.99 and a gasoline powered walk behind concrete saw for a 20-inch diamond blade, wet, 7^{5/8} maximum cutting depth \$3110.83 to be split between the borough and the water and sewer authorities. The borough contribution would be a little over \$1,000 if approved.

On a Frisbee/Minton motion, Council unanimously voted to approve the purchase of a 3.6HP Honda Vibratory Rammer Jumping Jack Tamper at 3550PSF for \$3187.99.

On a Minton/Morgan motion, Council unanimously voted to approve the purchase of a walk-behind, concrete saw, gas powered at a cost of \$3110.83 split three ways.
